Overview

At Beaver Area Middle School, a group of 7th and 8th-grade students, with the guidance of Language Arts teacher Mrs. Diamond Linn and Social Studies teacher Mr. Ryan Hulme, created a Wisdom Corridor. They asked teachers three important questions then selected the best answer of the three.

The students then turned the teacher responses into posters with QR codes linking to the interviews. This interactive display offers valuable advice and is set to grow each year with new contributions from students and staff.
